**WHEREAS**, the Gloucester Township Mayor and Council are pleased to salute Gavin Gallo, a resident of Gloucester Township in recognition of his outstanding accomplishments, and

**WHEREAS, Gavin Gallo** began running track for TNT Express Track Club in West Deptford a year ago. In his first year, Gavin qualified for Districts, then Regional's, and ultimately for the 2013 National AAU Junior Olympics in both the 1500 meter and 800 meter run which took place in Detroit, Michigan at the end of July. He is 8 years old, but runs in the 9 year old age group. Gavin will turn 9 years old in November of this year. Gavin finished 19<sup>th</sup> out of 54 kids in the country, running a 5:40.67 in the 1500 meter and 33<sup>rd</sup> out of 84 kids in the 800 meter, running a 2:49.92. Next year he will strive to place in the top 8 at the 2014 AAU Junior Olympics which will be held in Des Moines, Iowa. In early July, he also ran in the Disney Club Championships at the ESPN Wide World of Sports in Orlando, Florida and finished in second place in the 1500 meter and received a silver medal. He placed 9<sup>th</sup> in the 800 meter as well, and

**WHEREAS**, the Gloucester Township Mayor and Council acknowledge the accomplishments of Gavin Gallo and with the strong support of his family and friends he performed with strength and determination throughout the year, and

**WHEREAS**, his talent and exemplary efforts in seeking and achieving athletic excellence have earned him the respect of the Gloucester Township Mayor and Council, as well as the pride of the residents of the State of New Jersey



# Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, Ovarian Cancer is called the “**silent disease**” because its symptoms are often vague or subtle, and a woman’s lifetime risk of getting Ovarian Cancer is 1 in 72; and

**WHEREAS**, at present, there are no early detection tests routinely conducted for Ovarian Cancer, the leading cause of gynecological cancer deaths in the United States, and where each year, more than 22,000 women are diagnosed with the disease and approximately 17,000 die from it; and


**WHEREAS**, if medical research can be developed, and if this deadly disease can be detected in it’s early stages, survival from Ovarian Cancer is 90-95 percent. Sadly however, the five-year survival rate for the disease is only 28 percent because it usually is not detected until later stages; and

**WHEREAS**, The Ovarian Cancer Awareness campaign was launched nationwide by the Ovarian Cancer National Alliance, located in Washington, DC. The month of September was designated, and a visual aid was established by utilizing the recognized cancer ribbon logo, with the ribbon color in teal; and


**WHEREAS**, The Susan Marie Rupp Foundation set as their mission to promote public awareness of this silent, deadly disease and its symptoms through their “teal ribbons of hope” Ovarian Cancer Awareness Campaign;

**ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 67A OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER ENTITLED, "PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, State of New Jersey that Chapter 67A of the Code of the Township of Gloucester be and is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 67A-9.1 "Prohibitions" be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

**F. BAMBOO PLANTING:**

It is determined the bamboo plant is an invasive plant and often difficult to control, and can and has caused significant damage to properties in the Township of Gloucester.

The purpose of this subsection is to preserve and protect private and public property from the damaging spread of bamboo grasses, protect property and indigenous plant materials from the invasive spread of bamboo and to maintain the general welfare of the residents of the Township of Gloucester.

**a.) Prohibition:** No owner, tenant or occupant of a property, or person, corporation or other entity, shall plant, install or cause or permit the planting or installation of plant species commonly known as "bamboo-running or clumping", including but not limited to the following plant genera: Arundinaria, Bambusa, Chimonobambusa, Dendrocalamus, Fargesia, Phyllostachys, Pleioblastus, Pseudosasa, Sasa, Sasaella and Semiarundinaria, upon any property located within the Township of Gloucester.

**b.) Duty to confine:** In the event any species commonly known as "bamboo-running or clumping" is located upon any property within the Township of Gloucester, prior to the effective date of this prohibition, the owner or occupant of said property shall confine such species to prevent the encroachment, spread, invasion or intrusion of same onto any other private or public property or public right of way. Said confinement shall be by a barrier, constructed in accordance with specification approved by the Code Enforcement Officer of the Township of Gloucester, and as may be amended from time to time, and inspected and permitted by the office of the Code Enforcement Officer. Failure to properly confine such bamboo shall require

removal. In lieu of the duty to confine, the property owner or occupant may elect to totally remove the bamboo from the property.

c.) **Removal:** In the event bamboo-running or clumping is present on the effective date of this prohibition and a complaint is received by the Township regarding an encroachment of any bamboo plant or root, and the Code Enforcement Officer of the Township by observation, inspection determines that there is an encroachment or invasion on any adjoining private or public property or public right of way, the Township shall notice the bamboo property owner in writing that the bamboo has invaded other private or public property or public right of way and demand the removal of the bamboo from such other private or public property or public right of way and the demand confinement against future encroachment or the total removal from the bamboo property owner's property. Notice shall be provided by certified, return receipt requested mail and regular mail. If the bamboo property owner does not remove or contract for the removal of the bamboo from such other private or public property or public right of way within 45 days of the date of notice, the Code Enforcement Officer of Township of Gloucester shall cause a citation to be issued with a penalty up to \$500.00 for each day the violation continues, enforceable through the Municipal Court of the Township of Gloucester, as well as civil proceedings for injunctive or civil relief. Nothing herein shall be interpreted as limiting the rights of a private property owner to seek civil relief through a Court of proper jurisdiction, nor the institution of civil proceedings against the proper parties. When an encroachment is upon public property or public right of way, the Township of Gloucester, at its discretion, may remove or contract for the removal of such bamboo from the Township property or public right of way, the cost of which shall be the responsibility of the bamboo property owner and shall be assessed as a lien against the property on which the bamboo growth originated. The cost of removal from the Township owned property and or public right of way shall include the installation of an appropriate barrier to prevent future bamboo invasion.

d.) **Replanting Prohibited:** Any bamboo-running or clumping either planted or caused to be planted or existing on the effective date of this regulation, may not



be replanted or replaced once such bamboo is or has become dead, destroyed, uprooted or otherwise removed.

SECTION 2. All ordinances and provisions thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection or part, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction, such section, subsection, part, clause or phrase shall be deemed to be severable from the remainder of the ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication as required by law.
