

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Conducting a Review of the Cleanup of the GEMS Landfill Superfund Site Gloucester Township, Camden County, New Jersey

The EPA is conducting a five-year review of the cleanup of the GEMS Landfill Superfund site to ensure that the implemented cleanup continues to be protective of public health and the environment and is functioning as designed. This is the EPA's third five-year review of the cleanup for this site. The EPA will review site operations, maintenance and monitoring information, as well as the status of any land-use controls.
