#### ORDINANCES: SECOND READING AND PUBLIC HEARING

#### O-10-42

ORDINANCE CREATING CHAPTER 59A, "RENTAL HOUSING AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE COMPLIANCE CODE" OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

Mr. Bianchini read amendments recently made to the ordinance. Mr. Carlamere stated that the amendments to the ordinance would not be substantive and the public hearing could proceed. He stated that the Council could move to amend as reflected. Mr. Hutchison made a motion to adopt with amendments, seconded by Mrs. Gentek.

Mr. Bianchini opened the hearing to the public.

Mr. Frank Weinstein of Cherry Hill stated that he owns a rental property in the township. He questioned the ability to be imprisoned for the actions of his tenant as stated in the ordinance. He stated that his only course of action is to have his rental evicted.

Mr. Carlamere stated that the committee hope was to address the communities with problems. He stated that tenants are living with poor conditions and have problems with the police continually.

Lori Greenberg of Shenandoah Village stated that Shenandoah has a unique problem as many of their units are in the tenants children's names and under this ordinance they would be renters. She asked that "or otherwise" be taken out of the ordinance under dwelling unit. She stated that she would like to clarify the record by saying that Shenandoah is not a rental community. Mr. Harrison who represents Korman Residences and Millbridge Gardens thanked the Mayor for reaching out to the apartment complexes. He stated that he has significant concerns with this ordinance. Mr. Harrison expressed his concern to the council. He stated he would like to suggest that the ordinance be changed to do the inspections on a periodic basis or when the unit becomes vacant. He stated that he is concerned with giving out keys to the apartments and in making the occupants names open to the public. He stated that the ordinance goes beyond what it should. Mr. Carlamere stated that it would be an annual inspection. He stated that the Rent Stabilization Ordinance is being revised at this time. He stated that the target date for the startup of this ordinance is January Mr. Harrison stated he would like to see the vote on this ordinance delayed.

John McLaughlin, a resident of Shenandoah asked if the inspections apply to individual units. Mr. Carlamere stated that it would require inspections of the clubhouse, utility hook ups and the mailbox areas.

Mr. Kibelstis of 81 Shelly Street asked if this applies to hotels, Camden County College, etc and how it affects Franklin Square, Mullen Manor and Gloucester Senior Housing.

The owner of Millbridge Garden Apartments thanked the Council for letting him speak. He stated that since he has purchased the Millbridge complex he has tried to improve the complex. He stated that he has invested a lot of time and money. He stated that the tenants have more rights than the landlords now. He stated that he understands the logic behind the ordinance, in that the township is trying to do something that can make the enforcement of non-compliant units more effective. He asked council to consider this ordinance seriously as it will cost his complex approximately \$50,000.00 a year.

Linda Musser of Cameron Circle asked Council to consider tabling this ordinance Tanya Brown of Erial asked the Council not to proceed with this ordinance.

Mr. Carlamere stated that Council is addressing the concerns of the township when complexes are well below standards. He stated that when Millbridge previously came in before the township, and the Council passed vacancy de-control for them at their request. He stated that the blight needs to be addresses.

Joe Reed of Millbridge homes asked who is going to be inspecting these units. Mr. Bianchini stated that there will be an interlocal with the Housing Authority

A resident stated that he doesn't like the word mitigation in the ordinance and the ordinance should say affirmative offense, if instituted in a court action. He also stated that he feels it is a bad idea to give out peoples name and addresses. There was a question as to how much the inspectors will be paid and it was stated that this will be budget neutral.

Mayor Mayer stated that he appreciates the consideration of Council. He stated that he wants to improve the quality of life for the residents of these units and he wanted to thank all those involved with this ordinance. He stated that he appreciates the comments from the public and stated that he has reached out to the landlords. He stated that he has been open and has not rushed the ordinance. He stated that this is streamlining rent control. He asked that Council move forward and help improve the quality of life for the residents. Mr. Bianchini stated that the ordinance will be revised by some of the suggestions made this evening.

Mr. Hutchison made a motion to approve as amended, seconded by Mrs. Gentek.

Mrs. Evans stated that we are living in the United Stated not the USSR and we shouldn't disregard people who speak and she therefore voted no.

Mr. Hutchison stated that some people continue to be made a part of improving the sections of town. He stated that it goes a long way to improve blighted areas. He voted yes. Mr. Schmidt voted yes.

Mrs. Gentek voted yes and stated that there are 70,000 in the community who she needs to answer to. She stated that there are so many absentee landlords. She also thanked all those landlords who came to the meeting. She stated that everything needs to be done to protect the residents.

Mr. Bianchini stated that there are certain neighborhoods and complexes in the township that are in deplorable condition, and he stated that along with the Mayor, they have done their due diligence and have come up with an ordinance to protect the residents and owners and he therefore voted yes.

Motion carried 4-1.

ORDINANCE DETERMINING NECESSITY TO ACQUIRE SIDEWALK EASEMENTS FOR THE WILLIAMSTOWN ROAD SIDEWALK PROJECT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY; AND AUTHORIZING PROPER OFFICIALS OF THE TOWNSHIP TO ACQUIRE SAME BY NEGOTIATIONS OR CONDEMNATION

Mr. Bianchini opened the hearing to the public.

Mr. Kibelstis stated that the Planning Board has the responsibility of putting in sidewalks. It was stated that this request came from residents in the area and that these sidewalks would help the residents when they are walking to the adjacent shopping center. It was stated that these would be the asphalt type of sidewalk and most of the time the property owner's just deed the property to the township without cost. Mr. Kibelstis stated that Lot #4 was owned by a corporation and had a tax abatement on it. It was discussed whether money was put into the sidewalk trust account from this property. John McLaughlin a former member of the Planning Board stated that sidewalks are required, and getting payment in lieu of the sidewalks was permitted if nothing was built on the property at that time.

There being no further comment, the public hearing was closed.

O-10-44 ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GLOUCESTER, COUNTY OF CAMDEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING ORDINANCE O-06-23 AND ADOPTING THE INTERCHANGE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-I ET SEQ., LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW

**WHEREAS,** the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, previously designated certain properties, formerly known as Block 13104, Lots 1, 3.02, 7, 9, and 12 on the Township of Gloucester Tax Map, and now known as Block 13104, Lots 7, 9 and 12; Block 13105, Lot 1; Block 13106, Lot 1; Block 13198, Lot 1, and Block 13199, Lot 1, as being in need of redevelopment ("Redevelopment Area"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester adopted the Cooper Medical Services Redevelopment Plan on August 14, 2006, by Ordinance O-06-23, to govern the development of the Redevelopment Area; and

**WHEREAS**, over the past several years, several events have necessitated an amendment to the initial redevelopment plan, including the completion of a new highway interchange for Route 42 and College Drive on August 27, 2010, a well-documented economic downturn, and the creation of new State and Federal programs designed to spur economic growth; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester finds that the public health, safety, morals, and welfare of the community shall be promoted by the virtue of revisions to the previously enacted redevelopment plan; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester has reviewed a revised redevelopment plan entitled "Interchange Redevelopment Plan," which replaces any existing redevelopment plan(s) for the Redevelopment Area, and which the Township Council believes will facilitate economic growth and development in the Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the Township of Gloucester has adopted a Master Plan providing for the appropriate use and development of lands in the Township in a manner that will promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare and has determined that the

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council does hereby make the following findings for adoption of the Redevelopment Plan pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7, Adoption of Redevelopment Plan:

- A) The Planning Board of the Township of Gloucester in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6, conducted a public hearing on November 22, 2005, during which factual testimony was taken and all persons who were or would be affected by the Redevelopment Area had an opportunity to be heard and no written objections were filed; and
- B) The Planning Board of the Township of Gloucester is required to provide the Township Council a report containing its recommendation concerning the Interchange Redevelopment Plan including objectives consistent with the goals for development and redevelopment of the Township as expressed in the Master Plan; and
- C) Township Council does hereby desire to move forward with first reading of this Ordinance subject to review and report by the Planning Board; and
- D) It is the intent of Township Council to move forward with second reading and final adoption of this Ordinance, in the appropriate manner, and in accordance with Township Council's review of recommendations of the Planning Board.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, State of New Jersey as follows:

- SECTION 1. The Township Council does hereby adopt the "Interchange Redevelopment Plan," in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7, as the redevelopment plan for the Redevelopment Area so designated and replacing any existing redevelopment plan(s) for the Redevelopment Area.
- SECTION 2. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-7(c), the Zoning Map, as included in the Land Development Ordinance of the Township of Gloucester, be and hereby is amended to designate the Redevelopment Area as the "IR Interchange Redevelopment District."
- SECTION 3. The Township Council remains designated as the Redevelopment Entity under the "Interchange Redevelopment Plan," and may proceed with clearance, replanning, development, and redevelopment of the Redevelopment Entity to effectuate the purposes of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law.
- SECTION 4. All ordinances and provisions thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- SECTION 5. If any section, subsection or part, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid by judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction, such section, subsection, part, clause or phrase shall be deemed to be severable from the remainder of the ordinance.
- <u>SECTION 6.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication as required by law.
