Gloucester Premium Outlets Celebrate Grand Opening!



Mayor David Mayer, other government officials, and members of the Simon company team cut the ribbon signifying the opening of the Gloucester Premium Outlets at Gloucester Township, between Route 42 and the Black Horse Pike. The Opening weekend drew massive crowds coming to see the finished project and join in the celebration. Stores offered specials throughout the weekend and there were other festivities such as outdoor concerts and fireworks. This 90-store outlet center is the largest economic development in the township history, providing 800 permanent retail jobs and 300 temporary construction jobs. There will also be additional commercial development on the pad sites in the near future.

ATTENTION DOG AND CAT OWNERS



On Saturday, October 17, 2015, Gloucester Township will be having our Annual Rabies Clinic. The Clinic will be held at the Gloucester Township Senior Center on Chews Landing Road,

adjacent to the Municipal Building between the hours of 9:00am and 10:30am for dogs and 10:30am and 11:00am for cats. The rabies shots for dogs and cats are free.

The Clerk's Office will be setting appointments October 13th - October 15th, 8:00am - 3:00pm. Please call 228-4000, Ext. 3241 between those dates for an appointment.

CHAPTER 47 - PETS

Dogs and cats are strictly prohibiting from: running loose (at large), defecating on any portion of public or private property (owners must dispose of feces in a suitable and sanitary manner) and habitual/excessive barking is prohibited.

Licensing of Hawkers, Peddlers, Canvassers and Solicitors: Local Ordinance Chapter 58

A hawker, peddler and/or vendor includes any person, whether or not a resident of the Township of Gloucester, traveling about the Township of Gloucester either on foot, by vehicle or by any other manner, means or method, who shall go from house to house, place to place or street to street conveying or transporting goods, products, wares, merchandise, food or drink or any product thereof, offering or exposing the same for sale or making sales and delivering articles to purchasers.

The hours of operation by a hawker, peddler or vendor under this ordinance shall be between 9am and 9pm. All hawkers, peddlers and vendors must file for a license. Once the background investigation is completed and if approved they will be issued an identification card that they must wear at all times when soliciting.

If you are approached by a hawker, peddler or vendor that is not displaying identification or is not registered please contact the Gloucester Township Police Department at 228-4500 (non emergency) or dial 911 for an emergency.

BRUSH PICKUP



As per Township Ordinance, branches, hedge trimmings, light brush clippings, etc. must be securely tied into **three foot (3') bundles** that can be easily handled and the diameter of any branch may not exceed six inches (6"). The bundles shall not exceed **fifty (50) pounds** in weight. Public Works will pick up bundles on your designated day only if the ordinance is followed.

We are not a tree service. During storm damage, we will work with residents to pick up their brush, however the ordinance must be followed. No commercial vehicles can dump at Public Works. For questions on brush pick-up please call Public Works at 856-228-3144.

The GTMUA will pick up your grass in bags until Oct. 30, 2015. Please separate your grass from yard debris, sticks, trash, etc or it will not be picked up by the GTMUA. To contact the GTMUA, please call 856-227-8666.



Help us Recycle:

Public Works accepts car batteries, used oil, eye glasses, ink cartriges, metals and concrete. All items must be delievered to the Public Works building during office hours.

White Goods Pick-Up

Public Works now picks up white goods: refridgerators, air conditioners, ranges, washers, dryers and hot water heaters. Please call PW by 4pm on Tuesdays at 856-228-3144 for items to be picked up on Wednesdays.

Bagged Grass Clippings and Bagged Leaves



11/1-3/15 - GTPW collects bagged grass and bagged leaves WEEKLY on your recycling day with the exception of Friday which will be picked up on Thursday. GTPW will not accept plastic trash bags. Please note: grass clippings generated by a commercial land-scaper will not be collected.

GTPW collects leaves according to the fall leaf schedule. A second pick up will start after the first round is complete, weather permitting. Residents are reminded to rake their leaves curbside, NOT IN THE STREET, only during the fall leaf schedule which ends 12/31. After this time all leaves must be bagged.

Autism/Development Disability Registration

The Gloucester Township Police Department has created a registry for individuals with Autism or disabilities in efforts to give police quick access in an emergency to critical information about a person who is registered. The registry can provide police with emergency contact information, detailed physical descriptions, known routines, favorite attractions or special needs of an individual with Autism Disorder or other disabilities such as: Alzheimer's, Dementia, Down Syndrome or any other endangered individuals. This information can greatly assist police officers when time is essential in communicating and dealing with an emergency situation involving a person with Autism Disorder as well as other disabilities.

The registration form asks for valuable information that police may need when helping individuals with Autism Disorder or any other disability. We ask that all questions be filled out completely and a current photograph be provided. If you are unable to supply a photograph, we can take one for you. The information you provide is confidential and will only be used by law enforcement.

Gloucester Township Police Partner with the Center for Family Services

Over the summer, the Gloucester Township Police Department has entered into a partnership with the Center for Family Services to further assist the residents of our town by creating a Community Connections Family Success Center at the Family Resource



Center located at 1324 Little Gloucester Rd., Blackwood, NJ. Center for Family Services is committed to changing the odds for children and families across southern New Jersey. They offer several programs focused on supporting and empowering individuals, families, and communities to achieve a better life through vision, hope, and strength. CFS staffs the Family Success Center throughout the week holding seminars and workshops for Township. All of the program and activities are free of charge but they do encourage participants to pre-register for events as space is limited.

Just recently, they held a resume building workshop to assist residents with drafting their resumes in preparation for several job opportunities at the new Gloucester Outlets. They had several attendees stop in to create professional looking resumes to give them a leg up in the search for a new job.

The Center also offers a homework help where local children can come and have a staff member assist them in completing their homework assignments after school. They have also held several family dinners which are every other Thursday night between 4:00 pm and 6:00 pm.

Citizens Can Drop Off Their Unused Prescription Medications at Anytime

Throughout the nation, prescription drugs are quickly becoming the number one drug of choice for juveniles to abuse and often their supply of these medications come from their parents, grandparents, or from the homes of their friends.

Gloucester Township Residents have an opportunity to drop off unused and/or expired medicine in one of our two prescription drug drop boxes. This is a free service to our residents. One drop box will be located in the Watch Desk of the police department and the second drop off box will be located in the main entrance area to the township municipal building. The drop off boxes will accept pills but it is not capable of accepting any liquids, thermometers, needles, aerosol cans or inhalers.

School Bus Safety

Taking the bus for the first time is a big step for your child. Help your kids get a gold star in bus safety by following these tips.

The Hard Facts

School buses are the safest mode of motorized transportation for getting children to and from school, but injuries can occur if kids are not careful and aware when getting on and off the bus.



Top Tips

- Walk with your kids to the bus stop and wait with them until it arrives. Tell kids to stand at least three giant steps back from the curb as the bus approaches and board the bus one at a time.
- Teach kids to wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before getting off and never to walk behind the bus.
- If your child needs to cross the street after exiting the bus, he or she should take five giant steps in front of the bus, make eye contact with the bus driver and cross when the driver indicates it's safe. Teach kids to look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- Instruct younger kids to use handrails when boarding or exiting the bus. Be careful of straps or drawstrings that could get caught in the door. If your children drop something, they should tell the bus driver and make sure the bus driver is able to see them before they pick it up.
- Drivers should always follow the speed limit and slow down in school zones and near bus stops. Remember to stay alert and look for kids who may be trying to get to or from the school bus.
- Slow down and stop if you're driving near a school bus that is flashing yellow or red lights. This means the bus is either preparing to stop (yellow) or already stopped (red), and children are getting on or off.
