### Township Budget for 2015 Shows Zero Tax Levy Increase

For the fifth year out of six since he's been Mayor, Mayor David Mayer submitted a Budget with a zero municipal tax levy increase. The Budget is supported and approved by Council.

Mayor Mayer has been progressive in leading the way with multiple means of cost-savings and holding the line on expenses.

In particular, the single-stream recycling program has increased the recyclable material which has also reduced the amount of disposable waste. This reduction in waste has saved money on trash collection and disposal fees. In addition, the Mayor's work with cooperative purchasing with other municipalities has also lead to cost savings in collection and disposal fees.

Several towns in the County have joined with GT to form joint-service contracts. First done in 2012, the contract renewal is up later in the year and the Mayor hopes to continue the savings.

New solar and other energy saving projects installed over the past few years are contributing to savings. Solar energy on township buildings and the schools have already saved over \$300,000 dollars and will provide clean energy for the future.

The Township is also pleased that through Economic Development efforts, the ratable base has increased \$40 million dollars for 2015.

## Timber Creek Regional HS Awarded the NJ Dept. of Education's Green Ribbon Award for Environmental Stewardship

Timber Creek Regional High School is invested in environmentally responsible actions and behaviors that lead to greater environmental and ecological stewardship and a reduced carbon footprint. The Black Horse Pike Regional School District as a whole and Timber Creek as a school has an operating Green Team consisting of students, administrators, teachers and community leaders that work towards identifying energy inefficiencies, waste reduction possibilities and generally preventing the use of excess water, electricity and other materials. The Green Team commits to changing behaviors, practices and products that lead to greater energy efficiencies and results in responsible and sustainable environmental stewardship.

Timber Creek's environmental impact has been measured by its reduction of Metric Tons of Carbon Dioxide per person. Prior to the Green Team, Timber Creek Regional High School's Carbon Dioxide output per person was 5.19 Metric Tons. Today, because of all of the changes at Timber Creek, the Carbon Dioxide output is 2.51 Metric Tons per person. Moreover, Timber Creek has measured a 23% reduction in electric and natural gas due to adopting environmentally conscientious practices. We are taking great pride in our ability to effect change as stewards of the environment at Timber Creek Regional High School.



## Licensing of Hawkers, Peddlers, Canvassers and Solicitors: Local Ordinance Chapter 58

A hawker, peddler and/or vendor includes any person, whether or not a resident of the Township of Gloucester, traveling about the Township of Gloucester either on foot, by vehicle or by any other manner, means or method, who shall go from house to house, place to place or street to street conveying or transporting goods, products, wares, merchandise, food or drink or any product thereof, offering or exposing the same for sale or making sales and delivering articles to purchasers.

The hours of operation by a hawker, peddler or vendor under this ordinance shall be between 9am and 9pm. All hawkers, peddlers and vendors must file for a license. Once the background investigation is completed and if approved they will be issued an identification card that they must wear at all times when soliciting.

If you are approached by a hawker, peddler or vendor that is not displaying identification or is not registered please contact the Gloucester Township Police Department at 228-4500 (non emergency) or dial 911 for an emergency.

## SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

In accordance with our NJDEP Tier A Municipal Stormwater General Permit, the Twp. adopted various Ordinances to regulate the impact of stormwater runoff and pollutants on the environment.

**1. Pet Waste:** This requires pet owners to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property. It prevents fecal contamination from impacting the local waterways.

**2. Litter:** This states it is unlawful to throw, drop, discard or otherwise place litter of any nature upon any public or private property, other than in a litter receptacle. This prevents unsightly & unsanitary conditions & prevent litter from impacting waterways.

**3. Improper Disposal of Waste:** This states that it is illegal to dispose of waste in any place not specifically designate for the purpose of solid waste storage or disposal. The purpose is to prevent unsanitary conditions and groundwater pollution.

**4. Wildlife Feeding:** Feeding of water fowl on municipal park property is prohibited by Ordinance. The Township enacted the Ordinance as a method to reduce water fowl population in response to health concerns regarding bacteria which is harmful to humans and fish populations.

**5. Yard Waste:** Yard waste is regulated by Ordinance which establishes the current zone collection system and the methods of collecting leaves, brush, and other yard waste. The purpose is to keep leaves and grass out of the storm sewer system.

**6. Illicit Connections:** This makes it unlawful to connect any pipe or device to the municipal storm sewer system that is intended to discard, spill or dump any material other than stormwater runoff or ground water (sump pumps) into the system. The purpose of this Ordinance is to prevent pollution and contamination of waterways which receive discharge from our storm sewers.

The transport of pollutants into local water bodies destroys fish, wildlife and habitats; threatens public health and causes the loss of recreational and aesthetic value. We have enacted these Ordinances to protect our environment, and to keep pollutants that are commonly conveyed by stormwater from adversely impacting our waterways and groundwater supplies.

Please keep grass clippings out of the street and our waterways. It is against DEP state and local regulations. The grass clippings clog our storm waterways and put toxic chemicals into our waterways.

## The Operation of Certain Off Road Vehicles is Prohibited in the Township

The operation of motorized scooters, mini-bikes, trail-bikes, go-peds, dirt bikes, quads, and other similar motorized recreational devices, electric or gas powered, are prohibited by Gloucester Township Ordinance 82-1 from being operated:

- On private property without the written consent of the property owner in their possession while operating the recreational device
- On any public, municipal, or Board of Education Grounds or property.
- On any public sidewalks or public streets or areas dedicated commonly used for pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- On any common areas, parking areas or open space of any apartment complex, multi-family, residential, industrial complex or development.

Violators may be charged in violation of Local Ordinance 82-1 and New Jersey State Traffic Laws, which also prohibit operation of these recreational vehicles.

## Dog Walkers Watch 2015 Kickoff Event

Dog Walker Watch (DWW) is a crime awareness program sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) that encourages dog walkers nationwide to serve as “extra eyes and ears” for local law enforcement agencies. ## Traffic Safety Bureau Yellow Dot Program



The GTPD Traffic Safety Unit has established a new yellow dot program for residents. The yellow dot program is a simple method of documenting a person's medical and emergency contact information and notifying emergency responders of that information in the event of a serious motor vehicle crash or emergency where the driver is incapacitated or unable to speak.

Residents will receive a yellow emergency information form that they complete with their information, any serious medical issues, medications, doctors contact information or anything that they feel would be beneficial to first responders, as well as recent photograph of themselves. The form is then placed in the vehicle's glove compartment. Along with the form is a 2 ½ inch yellow, reflectorized circular decal that is placed on the rear window or rear driver's side window. It is this "yellow dot" that signifies responders that the driver's information is located within the vehicle in case of an emergency.

The yellow dot program is a voluntary program. Residents may pick up the yellow dot forms at the Gloucester Township Police Department. Residents may also contact the Traffic Services Bureau at 856-374-5715 or [police@gtpolice.com](mailto:police@gtpolice.com) to have the form mailed to them.
